YOU MIGHT THINK it takes a year to plan a wedding, but lifestyle expert Susie Coelho swears that sometimes the best events are the most spontaneous ones. (She pulled together her own nuptials in Aspen in just two weeks.) "The same philosophy applies to weddings as to any other party," says Susie, whose new book, Style Your Dream Wedding (Thomas Nelson Publishers), hits store shelves in February. "Brides should look at it as simply the best party they've ever thrown." In Susie Land, this concept doesn't necessarily require big bucks: She once created an elegant altar using an old table set on apple crates, draped in fabric, and topped with Casablanca lilies, candles, and lemon leaves. "Every choice should convey a sense of who you are."-Hillary Quinn

Eventually, Kate left medicine and the U.K. and moved to the U.S. to launch a career in special events-which now includes planning some of New York's swankiest weddings. But no matter how large the budget or guest list, Kate's goal is to create an intimate affair: "I try to put together an event that represents the couple as a family for the very first time. That gives me enormous satisfaction."-Hillary Quinn



### INGRID'S TAKEAWAY TIPS

"For dessert, set up a station of churros—crispy doughnutlike pastries—with a variety of sauces, such as chocolate and butterscotch. Interactive experiences get people talking."

"Serve inexpensive comfort food, like arroz con pollo [Spanish chicken and rice], in cool little ramekins with mini spoons, and everyone will think they're eating a special hors d'oeuvre!"



DIANN VALENTINE'S PASSION for planning started early-when she was high-school seniorclass president, to be exact. "I was the one who would always say, 'Let's not do a regular banner-let's do it extra-large and paint it a wild color!" she recalls. So when a cousin asked if Diann would pitch in as her wedding planner, the ambitious student jumped in, juggling florist and caterer meetings with homework assignments. "Eventually, my name grew, and I was able to pay my way through college," says Diann, who's now a favorite among sports stars and Hollywood celebrities (she planned Usher's wedding last fall). But whether the budget is lean or lavish, the goal is always the same: "to create a beautiful celebration that honors love." Now, that's passion. - Hillary Quinn

"Make over your dance floor by creating an 'ocean' using white flooring, and rotating blue and green LED lights in flame patterns—the projected image looks like seaweed!"

WHEN OPERA-SINGER-turned-wedding-planner Carla Ruben talks about how she's going to orchestrate an event, it's music to a bride's ears. That's because this pro treats every wedding as a performance. "It's like you're opening and closing a show in one night," says Carla. Take her approach to entertainment: She might start with four classical guitarists during pre-ceremony cocktails, segue to a cappella singers for the vows, then introduce a steel-drum band that ramps up as the party gets going. "You don't want to give guests everything at once. It's more fun to keep wowing them."—Hillary Quinn



"We erected a grand tent within a village of fully furnished sleeping tents, a town square, and even bathing facilities so guests could stay on the property all weekend." The bridal couple's response? Sold!—Hillary Quinn



FLORIST-TO-THE-STARS Mark Held (most recently of the DeGeneres/de Rossi wedding) claims he fell into the business "by accident": At the age of eight, Mark created centerpieces for his summer camp's mess hall by gathering "interesting" leaves splashed with streaks of red. "The camp director took one look and told me I'd used poison ivy," he recalls with a chuckle. "What can I say? They were pretty!" These days, when brides get the itch for extraordinary flowers, Mark, co-author of Fabulous Parties (Ryland, Peters & Small), is who they call. Whether he's trucking 150,000 roses to an out-of-state wedding, or securing magnolia leaves to an alfresco tablecloth, his mission is simple: "Surround people with beautiful flowers and they will be happy."-Hillary Quinn





that happen."-Hillary Quinn





WHEN YOU'VE PLANNED more than 500 weddings over the course of your career, you might worry about keeping things fresh. Not Susan Holland, who prides herself on pulling a rabbit out of a hat for each and every bride. "It's just like a teacher who has been teaching the same subject for many years—if you really find the soul of your subject, you can create something new," says this former artist. These days, Susan enjoys producing festive, interactive "experiences," like fondue dinners for several hundred, or having Pied Piper-like street performers lead wedding guests to a tucked-away ceremony site. "I take enormous pleasure when a bride says, 'Now that I've hired you, I can start looking forward to my wedding." Let the fun begin!-Hillary Quinn

One way to trim the budget is to skip the sit-down dinner and do a series of unexpected, delicious food bars, like dim sum, tempura, antipasto, or even Belgian French fries.

"Decorating with a single element, like a color, can override a drab room-try hundreds of white candles, white peonies, white linens, and snowy ribbons suspended from the ceiling."

SIT DOWN FOR A CONSULTATION with Jung Lee and you might be surprised at her questions: This clever New Yorker will ask you about your favorite hotels, shops, clothing brands, restaurants, even your fantasy home. "I tend to almost deconstruct people to build their perfect wedding," she explains. The technique worked for one unhappy bride who was being forced to have a New York City ceremony for 300, but who really wanted an intimate wedding in the Italian countryside. By bringing in antique rugs, red votives, and an angelic boys' choir, Jung gave the church an old European feel; at the reception, she had all 300 guests sit at one long banquet table, a Puccini opera playing in the background. The bride's reaction? Bellissimo!—Hillary Quinn

"You can turn the getting-ready hour into a beautiful time for the bride and her bridesmaids by playing great background music, serving tea sandwiches, and lighting scented candles."



IT STARTED INNOCENTLY ENOUGH, Niki Delacueva (who loved to decorate) and her husband, Rene (who loved to cook), escaped from their day jobs by throwing weekend dinners with great food and clever tablescapes. Eventually, guests began to ask for help in planning their own parties, and a business was born. Theirs is a break-all-the-rules style: When two artists were looking for "a gritty, edgy wedding location," Niki found a shoe warehouse in an ungentrified L.A. area. "It was floor-to-ceiling cardboard boxes and packing materials. But we carved a path to the freight elevator with rose petals and hurricane lamps," she says. "When guests got to the rooftop ceremony, they were treated to an insane panoramic view!" Edgy-and romantic.-Hillary Quinn


"At outdoor venues, you might save money by using the same tenting or lighting as a couple marrying there the day before or after you. Ask your caterer to put you in touch with them."

Rather than cluttering the table with favors, treat guests to an end-of-the-night surprise by having the valet hang a sweet treat, with a note, from the rearview mirrors of their cars.

For a dramatic yet affordable centerpiece, buy inexpensive succulents like echeveria or donkey's tale from a nursery, place in terra-cotta pots, then highlight with pin-spot lighting.


